INCOMING MAIL to AUSTRALIA WWII 1939-1945.

All will be aware that the years 1939 -1945 were a time of great change.

Not only was a world war effecting lives, flight had not long entered the scene and was subject to great disruption as a result of areas cut off by conflict.

Mail was often disrupted and a letter sent to a loved one by airmail to arrive as quickly as possible was sometimes lost in a disaster or transferred to a



transit by ship taking considerably longer than expected.

Temporary Post Offices or FIELD POST OFFICES were set up in remote locations throughout the world in areas of hostility.

CENSORSHIP became a common event as sensitive information had to be avoided at all cost.

The need for civilian families to "keep in touch" with their member in the services was paramount and the only way this could occur was by mail. The Postal services all around the world were never more active in their attempts to "deliver the mail".

In the fields of battle the need for "contact from home" was vital and the requirement to send a letter home was a real need.

This was well understood by the various Governments, Services and Postal Authorities and they made great attempts to keep mail flowing throughout this difficult time.

Examples that follow of Commercial & Private correspondence give a brief glimpse into mail that had set out from various theatres of war and reached their intended recipient during this dark period in our history.

Each cover (1940 through 1945) has some surface indication of its movements, but there is no indication of the story that was hidden within each envelope.

On arrival in Australia it was opened and a rectangular PASSED BY CENSOR V66..... applied on face. A very early example of sealing tape was applied Opened by Censor and 3 ,,, (3 dots hand written) Indicating a Victorian location.

The period between October 1931 and October 1940 proved to be a very difficult one for the Cypriots. The Governor at the time, Sir Richmond Palmer, took a number of suppressive measures including limitations on the administration and functioning of Greek schools, and prohibition of trade unions and associations of any kind and form. This regime became known as "Palmerokratia", named after the Governor. Its aim was to prevent local public interest in politics. There were strong protests against the regime but the suppressive measures were not lifted until the beginning of the Second World War, during which more than thirty thousand Cypriots joined the British armed forces.

This envelope was sent from Frankfurt during WWII to the Internment camp at Dhurringile near Tatura Vic. At the time there were 2376 German & Italian Internees at the camp.

This complete cover is rare in as much that the Government policy at the time was to remove the stamps from incoming mail in case they contained hidden messages on the rear.

The 10 millimes' ARMY POST Stamp with King Farouk's portrait was issued 16 December 1939 and was withdrawn 1 May 1941 when Postal Concessions allowed troops free postage for surface mail.

Other mail to Australia could use Australian stamps from 5 February 1941.

The c.d.s ARMY P.O. AM 1 was used at (1 Base PU) sub-B.P.O. and later at B.P.O. CAIRO.

At this time the first convey of troops arrived in Palestine on 14 February 1940 and a base P.O. was established in Jerusalem later that month, by September 1940 the date stamp was moved to MERSA MATRUH EGYPT. It then moved to KANTRA where it was used until September 1942

This is a very early use of the date stamp that had been bought with the No1 AIF Base PU from Australia.





As the starting point of the Allied trans-African supply line to Egypt that became officially known as the West African Reinforcement Route, Takoradi became one of the most important bases for Britain's Royal Air Force (RAF). Between August 1940 and June 1943, over 4,500 British Blenheims, Hurricanes, and Spitfires were assembled at Takoradi and ferried to the Middle East.

Flight journey to Australia was through Belgian airline SABENA to LAGOS – KHARTOUM – CAIRO Then B.O.A.C. Empire Route.

The 770th Bombardment Squadron was first activated in 1943, and became one of the earliest Boeing B-29 Superfortress units. It moved to the China Burma India Theatre's in April 1944.

The B29 Bomber known as "Vixen" had as its Right Gunner Sgt G Peacock.

Returning from a mission Dec 7 1944 at 4.22am over Sianfu CHINA it failed to return.

Peacock earned the Air Medal and Purple Heart posthumously, he was from Kalamazoo Michigan USA.
