
2. The return to steam via the Indian Ocean - Overland via Southampton

Historical overview

The original P&O steam route via Galle was available to the Australian Colonies in the mid 1840's by private sailing vessels and continued intermittently via contract steamers.

After the Crimean War in 1856, the British Admiralty awarded the mail contract to the European & Australian Royal Mail Company. The route between Galle and Southampton was a duplicate of the P&O service. The company was plagued by inadequate maintenance facilities and too few ships, resulting in heavy penalties that were unsustainable.

A new contract in 1859 was awarded to the P&O Line who were able to fulfil their contract obligations.

Sydney, New South Wales 16.1.1857 to Locarno, Switzerland (E)

Single Rate - Underpaid:

Prepayment of 1/4d and underpaid 2d for a ½0z ship letter of 1/6d to Switzerland. "6"(d) manuscript in black credit to Great Britain for forwarding to Switzerland.

Postal Markings:

"PD" in red incorrectly applied at London to indicate the letter was paid to destination.

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Sydney 23.1.1857 per "Oneida". The ship broke down 400 miles west of Cape Leuwin, Western Australia and returned to King Georges Sound 23.2. Departed King Georges Sound 21.3 per "European" via Galle 4.4. to Suez; overland to Alexandria; "Etna" 25.4 via Malta 29.4 to Southampton 8.5; by rail to London 9.5; by steamer to Calais 9.5; by rail via Paris10.5, Basel 11.5, arriving Locarno 13.5.1857. (117 days).

Note: This was the first homeward voyage of the European and Australian Royal Mail Co. to England and was a complete financial disaster. The Company lost the entire subsidy for this voyage and did not have a ship available for the May mail from Australia. Incidents such as this plagued the Company throughout the contract.

Sextuple Rate: Prepayment of 7/- for a 3oz ship letter to the City State of Hamburg; "4/-" manuscript in black debit to the City State of Hamburg from Great Britain 8d x 6 for forwarding.

Postal Markings: "P" in red applied at London representing payment to destination.

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 16.4.1857 per "Columbian" to Suez 28.5; overland to Alexandria; Cunard Line: "Jura" 30.5 to Malta, "Cumbria" 3.6 to Southampton 11.6; by rail to London 12.6; by steamer to Ostende; by rail in the closed bag via Aachen to Hamburg, arriving 14.6.1857. (64 days).

Note: The postal system of the City State of Hamburg was privately operated by the Turn & Taxis Post until 1858.

Single Rate:

Prepayment of 2/6d comprising 1/6d for a ½0z ship letter plus 1/- registration to New Brunswick;

"6d" in black debit to Great Britain for forwarding to New Brunswick;

"7½" (cents) manuscript in black for transatlantic and internal postage to be paid by the recipient.

Maryborough, Victoria 8.6.1857 to St. Johns, New Brunswick

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 26.6.1857 per "European" to Suez 14.8; overland to Alexandria; P&O Line: "Ripon"21.8, to Southampton 4.9; by rail via London 5.9 to Liverpool. The Allan Line: Departed Liverpool 9.9 per "Indian" to Quebec, Canada 19.9.; by private ship to St. Johns, New Brunswick, arriving 23.9.1857. (107 days).

Note: Although prepaid via Marseilles, the envelope should have been transferred to the "Vectis" which was transporting the mails via Marseilles. Instead, it was sent on the "Ripon" to Southampton.

Single Rate - Underpaid:

Prepayment of 2/6d and underpaid 1/4d for a 1/40z registered ship letter to Switzerland;

"2/4" manuscript in red credit to Great Britain for underpaid postage and forwarding to Switzerland.

Note: One other registered cover is known dated October 1857 prepaid 2/6d with a manuscript "2/4" in red credit to Great Britain.



Yackandandah, Victoria 13.10.1857 to Locarno, Switzerland

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 16.11.1857 per "City of Sydney" via Galle 11.12 to Suez 27.12, overland to Alexandria. Royal Mail Steam Packet Co: "Teviot" 29.12 to Southampton 12.1.1858; by rail to London 12.12; by steamer to Calais 13.1; by rail via Basel 14.1 to Locarno, arriving 18.1.1858. (97 days).

Ex Burrus, Perry, Winchester

The only registered cover from New South Wales to the Kingdom of Prussia recorded

Single Rate: Prepayment of 1/2d for a ½0z ship letter plus 6d registration to the Kingdom of Prussia; "8"(d) manuscript in red credit from Great Britain to the Kingdom of Prussia for forwarding; "9"(d) manuscript in black for the registration fee debit from the Kingdom of Prussia to Great Britain; converted to "7"(silbergroschen) manuscript in blue to be paid by the recipient.

Postal Markings:

"Recomandirt" in red applied for registered mail forwarded through the Aachen exchange office;



Sydney, New South Wales 10.11.1857 to Neustadt, Kingdom of Prussia

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Sydney 11.11.1857 per "City of Sydney" via Galle 11.12 to Suez 27.12; overland to Alexandria. Royal Mail Steam Packet Co: "Teviot" 29.12 to Malta; "Vanguard" 3.1.1858 to Southampton 12.1; by rail to London 13.1.; by steamer to Ostende; by rail via Aachen 14.1 to Neustadt, arriving 15.1.1858. (65 days).

Ex Druce, Forster, Alvarado, Palmer

One of the most important registered covers of the Australian Colonies

Single Rate:

Prepayment of 2/2d comprising 1/2 for a ½ oz ship letter to the City State of Bremen plus 1/registration.

"6"(d) handstamp in black for the inwards ship letter fee crossed through;

"18" (silbergroschen) credit for the postage and registration for forwarding to the City State of Bremen.

Note: The 1/- Registered Die II stamp is rouletted, and one of three covers recorded.

The 1d Emblem rouletted gauging 7-9 is believed to be the only example on cover recorded.

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 11.12.1857 per "European" via Galle 9.1.1858 to Suez 24.1; overland to Alexandria. Royal Mail Steam Packet Co.: "Tamar" 26.1 via Malta 29.1 to Southampton 6.2; by rail to London 8.2; by steamer to Ostende; by rail to the City State of Bremen.

Single Rate - Overpaid:

Prepayment of 1/6d and overpaid 11/2d for a 1/2 oz ship letter to Denmark.

"101/2"(d) manuscript in red credit from Great Britain to the Thurn & Taxis postal service;

"61/2" (silbergroschen) credit to the Thurn & Taxis office in Hamburg;

"franco" handstamp in black with "2"(skilling) manuscript in red for internal delivery within Denmark to be paid by the recipient.

Castlemaine, Victoria 14.6.1858 to Christiansfeld, Denmark

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 16.6.1858 per "Australasian" via Galle 11.7 to Suez 30.7; overland to Alexandria. Cunard Line: "Cambria" 1.8 to Southampton 14.8; by rail to London; by steamer to Ostende; by rail via Aachen to Hamburg 16.8; by rail to Christiansfeld, arriving 18.8.1858. (71 days).

Prepayment of 6d for a ½oz ship letter to England.



Adelaide, South Australia 10.7.1858 to Birmingham, England

Route - Private steamship: Departed Adelaide 10.7.1858 per "Havilah" to Melbourne. The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 16.7.1858 per "Emeu" via Galle 7.8 to Suez 24.8; overland to Alexandria, P&O Line: "Teviot" 26.8 via Malta 30.8 to Southampton 9.9; by rail via London 10.8 to Birmingham, arriving 10.9.1858. (62 days).

The only imperforate franking of a Valentine's propaganda envelope from South Australia recorded



Single Rate - Overpaid:

Prepayment of 1/4d and overpaid 2d for a ½0z ship letter to the Kingdom of Hannover. "8"(d) manuscript in black debit to Great Britain for forwarding to the Kingdom of Hanover.

Postal Markings:

"P" in red applied at London to indicate the letter was paid to destination.

Note: This large "P" marking is only known on mail addressed to Germany between May 1857 and March 1858.

Melton, Victoria 16.10.1858 to Nordhaufen, Kingdom of Hannover

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 18.10.1858 per "Victoria" to Galle 13.11; engine room of the "Victoria" flooded, mail transferred; **P&O** Line: "Oneida" 13.11 to Aden; "Oneida" engine failure, mail transferred; "Bengal" to Suez 5.12; overland to Alexandria, "Niagara" 7.12 to Southampton 18.12; by rail to London 20.12; by steamer to Ostende; by rail via Aachen 24.12, to Nordhaufen, arriving 27.12.1858. (71 days).

Prepayment of 5/8d comprising 4/8d for a ½ oz ship letter plus 1/- registration to Switzerland.

"4/2"(d) manuscript in red credit to Great Britain for forwarding a registered letter to Switzerland.

"68" (rappen) manuscript in red for internal postage for registered mail to be paid by the recipient.



Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 16.11.1858 per "Emeu" via Galle 8.12 to Suez 21.12; overland to Alexandria. P&O Line: Departed Alexandria 26.12 per "Panther" to Malta 31.12; "Teviot" 1.1.1859 to Southampton 11.1; by rail to London 11.1; by steamer to Calais 12.1; by rail to Zurich 14.1; overland via Chur 14.1 to Graubause, arriving 15.1.1859. (82 days).

Two examples of Valentine's Ocean Penny Post second design propaganda envelope from the Australian Colonies are recorded, this being the only one from Victoria.

Prepayment of 1/- for a ½ oz ship letter to New Brunswick.

"5"(d) manuscript in red credit to Great Britain for transatlantic shipment by a British packet;

"1"(d) handstamp in red credit from New Brunswick to Newfoundland for internal delivery.

Creswick Creek, Victoria 10.1.1859 to St. Andrews, New Brunswick

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 5.2.1859 per "Oneida" via Galle 28.2 to Suez 15.3; overland to Alexandria. P&O Line: Departed Alexandria 17.3 via Malta 21.3 to Southampton 31.3; by rail via London 1.4 to Liverpool 2.4. Cunard Line: Departed Liverpool 2.4 per "Europa" to New York 18.4; ; by steamer to St. John's, Newfoundland 21.4.1859; by steamer to St. Andrews. (over 75 days).

"8"(d) manuscript in black for the incoming ship letter fee crossed out since the envelope was paid to destination

Postal Markings:

"P" in red applied at London denoting paid to destination.

Melbourne, Victoria 4.2.1859 to the Duchy of Anhalt Kothen

Route - The European and Australian Royal Mail Co: Departed Melbourne 5.2.1859 per "Oneida" via Galle 28.2 to Suez 15.3; overland to Alexandria. P&O Line: Departed Alexandria 17.3 via Malta 21.3 to Southampton 31.3; by rail to London 1.4; by steamer to Ostende; by rail via Aachen 2.4 to Anhalt Kothen, arriving 8.4.1859. (63 days).

The only cover from the Australian Colonies to the Duchy of Anhalt Kothen recorded



Prepayment of 1/5d for a ½ oz ship letter to the Papal States. "11"(d) manuscript in red credit to France for forwarding to the Papal States

Postal Markings:

"PD" in red applied at London denoting paid to destination.

The earliest cover from Victoria to the Papal States recorded

Single Rate:

Prepayment of 1/4d and overpaid 2d for a ½0z ship letter to the Kingdom of Saxony.

"8"(d) manuscript in red credit from Victoria to Great Britain for forwarding to the Kingdom of Saxony;

"3d"(d) handstamp in red credit from Great Britain to the Kingdom of Saxony for forwarding to Luneburg.



Sandhurst, Victoria 15.5.1859 to Luneburg, Kingdom of Saxony

Route - P&O Line: Departed Melbourne 19.5.1859 per "Columbian" via Port Louis 24.6 to Suez 20.7; overland to Alexandria; "Rippon" 22.7 to Southampton 6.8; by rail to London 6.8; by steamer to Ostende; by rail via Aachen 7.8 to Luneburg. (over 84 days).

Note: The rate to the Kingdom of Saxony via Marseilles was 1/5d. Since this cover was underpaid by 1d, it was sent via the slower route via Southampton, and therefore, overpaid by 2d.

The earliest cover from the Australian Colonies to the Kingdom of Saxony recorded

Prepayment of 2/6d comprising 1/6d for a ½ oz ship letter to Switzerland plus 1/- Registration fee.

Postal Markings:

"REGISTERED/ BRAIDWOOD" handstamp in black confirming the payment of the registration fee; "P" in red applied at London denoting paid to destination.



Braidwood, New South Wales 4.7.1859 to Locarno, Switzerland

Route - P&O Line: Departed Sydney 14.7.1859 per "Northam" via Port Louis 7.8 to Suez 28.8; overland to Alexandria; "Ceylon" 5.9 via Malta 9.9 to Southampton 18.9; by rail to London 19.9; by steamer to Calais 19.9; by rail via Basle 21.9 to Locarno, arriving 23.9.1859. (71 days).

Note: The 6d Registration stamp prepaid the registration fees to within the colonies and to the United Kingdom. An additional 6d registration fee was required from the England to foreign destinations, although this regulation was not strictly adhered to.

Route - Private Steamship: Departed Sydney 16.11.1859 per "Wonga Wonga" to Melbourne. P&O Line: Departed Melbourne 18.11 per "Benares" via Port Louis 8.12 to Suez 24.12; overland to Alexandria; "Pera" 22.7 via Malta 1.1.1860 to Southampton 12.1; by rail to London, arriving 12.1.1860. (57 days).

Note: The "Benares" left Sydney for Melbourne on the 14.11.1859. Given the cover is cancelled on the 16.11, it must have caught the supplementary mail on the "Wonga Wonga" to arrive in time for the Melbourne sailing of the "Benares" on the 18.11.



Single Rate:

Prepayment of 1/2 and overpaid 2d for a ½0z ship letter to New Brunswick.

"8"(d) manuscript in red credit from Victoria to Great Britain for forwarding to New Brunswick crossed out and rerated;

"3"(d) manuscript in red credit from Great Britain to Canada for transatlantic shipment by a Canadian packet;

"1" (cent) handstamp in red credit to Canada for internal postage to New Brunswick.

Allan Line: Departed Liverpool 19.10 per "Nova Scotian" to Quebec 29.10; by road to Fredrickton, arriving 8.11.1859. (81 days).

One of the earliest covers from Victoria to New Brunswick recorded

Prepayment of 1/3d and overpaid 1d for a ½0z ship letter to the Kingdom of Prussia.

"8"(d) manuscript in red credit from Victoria to Great Britain for forwarding to the Kingdom of Prussia.

Route - P&O Line: Departed Melbourne 18.10.1859 per "Emeu", via Port Louis 9.11 to Suez 28.11; overland to Alexandria; "Ripon" 30.11 via Malta 4.12 to Southampton 14.12; by rail to London 14.10; by steamer to Ostende; by rail via Aachen 15.12 to Pless, arriving 17.12.1859. (61 days).

Prepayment of 1/6d and underpaid 6d for a ½0z ship letter of 2/- to the Kingdom of Sardinia.

Underpaid for via Marseilles route and sent via Southampton.

Postal Markings:

"INSUFFICIENTLY PAID/ VIA MARSEILLES"

handstamp in red applied at Melbourne recognising the underpayment;

"PD" handstamp in red applied at London and crossed out.

"4"(skillings) manuscript in red for internal postage to Wandsbeck to be paid by the recipient.

Eden, New South Wales 14.8.1860 to Wandsbeck, Duchy of Schleswig-Holstein

Route - P&O Line: Departed Sydney 22.8.1860 per "Salsette" to Galle 16.9; "Columbian" 19.9 to Suez 6.10; overland to Alexandria; "Ripon" 7.10 to Southampton 22.10; by rail to London, by steamer to Ostende; by rail in the closed bag via Aachen, the City State of Hamburg, and the Royal Danish Post in Hamburg 24.10, overland to Wandsbeck, arriving late October 1860.

Note: Although this cover was handstamped "P" in red in London denoting it was paid to destination, the pre-payment was only as far as the City State of Hamburg. The letter was transferred to the Royal Danish Post in Hamburg for transmission to Wandsbeck in the Duchy of Schleswig-Holstein, then part of the Kingdom of Denmark. The recipient had to pay the additional 4 skillings for local postage for delivery.

Allan Line: Departed Liverpool 22.10 per "Nova Scotian" to Quebec 9.11, by rail via Hamilton 10.11 and Drumbo 11.11 to Haysville, arriving 11.11.1863. (81 days).

Riverina combination covers

Towns near the Murray River in south west New South Wales could route overseas mail via Melbourne, Victoria to catch an earlier ship than would not have been possible had they been routed via Sydney. Such mail required pre payment from New South Wales for the inter colonial postage to Melbourne, and overseas postage from Victoria to foreign destinations.



Note: A reduced scan of the front of the cover is illustrated at the right.

Route - P&O Line: Departed Melbourne 26.12.1862 per "Northam" to Galle 15.1.1863; "Bengal" 18.1. to Suez; overland to Alexandria; "Ripon" 4.2 to Southampton 16.2.; by rail to London, arriving 16.2.1864. (52 days).

Note: This envelope was printed in Melbourne by Augustus Schuhkraft who produced a number of very similar envelopes for Victorian hotels from 1862 before going in to liquidation in 1866.

Postal Markings:

"PD" handstamp in red to indicate the letter was paid to destination.

"4½" (silbergroschen) manuscript in red credit to the Thurn & Taxis postal service in Hamburg for forwarding.

Route - P&O Line: Departed Melbourne 28.10.1863 per "Bombay" to Galle 17.11; "Nemesis" 18.11 to Suez 3.12; overland to Alexandria; "Pera" 5.12 via Malta 8.12 to Southampton 18.12; by rail London 18.12, by steamer to Ostende; by rail via Aachen and Hamburg to Flensburg, arriving 20.12.1863. (88 days).
