The Act of 1835 came into force on 21 October 1835 after being proclaimed on 23 June 1835. The Act determined that the Government could fix rates which were set out in an attached schedule. The inland charges under the Act were based on mileage similar to the system in Great Britain. The same scale was continued by the 1838 Act and remained in force until 31 December 1849.
